

# **EYP Impact Pathways**

The Early Years Partnership (EYP) Impact Pathways is a tool that aims to support communities to identify the main enablers and barriers to children and families thriving in their communities, co-design agreed and targeted community plans and test, trial and learn from evidence-based solutions.

EYP acknowledges that children are born into families, families live in communities and communities are impacted by state and federal government system and policies. Therefore, the EYP Impact Pathways have been structured to reflect these four EYP pillars: child, family, community and systems.

The enablers and barriers identified in the child, family and community pillars have been developed using frameworks that had been recommended by Telethon Kids Institute and subsequently adopted by EYI. These include:

- Children's Headline Indicators (AIHW, 2018)
- The Social and Family Functioning Framework (DSS, 2000); and
- The Kids in Communities Study (Goldfeld et al, 2017).

In addition, the fourth pillar of 'systems' has been developed based on work led by the Thriving Queensland Kids Partnership supported by ARACY (Systems Leadership for Child and Youth Well-being, 2022) and Centre for Policy and Development (Starting Better, A Guarantee for Young Children and Families, 2021).

The enablers and barriers have been reviewed and refined by the EYP Implementation Group, as respective content specialists across all EYP domains. Recommendations on cross-cutting enablers related to culture are still being explored.
